

Tactical Briefing

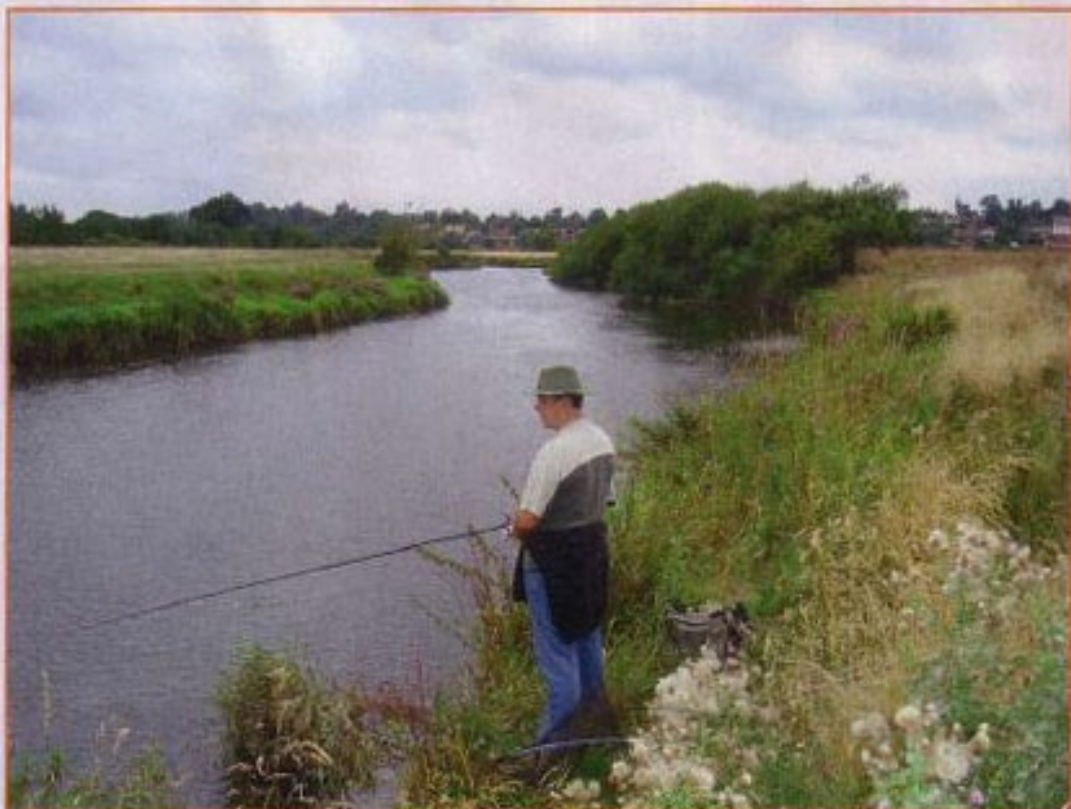
RIVER ARUN, PARHAM, PULBOROUGH, WEST SUSSEX

DESCRIPTION. Controlled by Pulborough AS fishing is on the left bank downstream of this tidal section from the confluence with the River Chilt for approximately 2.5 miles. The section has widths to 25 metres and contains good bream shoals with individual fish to 8 lb, pike to 30 lb, some carp to 20 lb, chub to 5 lb, roach and perch to 2 lb, dace to 10 oz plus sea trout.

TACTICS. For bream use a decent sized groundbait feeder loaded with crumb and chopped worm. On the hook try corn, redworm, maggot, caster, bread or combination baits. Chub to float or legered bread flake or maggot. Use a stick float with maggot or caster, over loose feed, for nets of roach, dace and odd chub. Pike to legered sea deadbaits, mackerel or smelt are recommended.

GOOD SWIMS. Try those areas marked on the fishery plan. Roach can show throughout.
